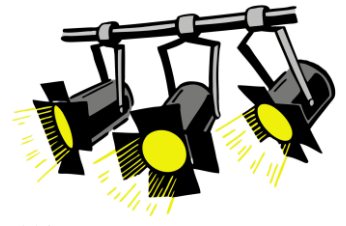
### **Easter treats and activities**

**Spotlight on the Leopards:**



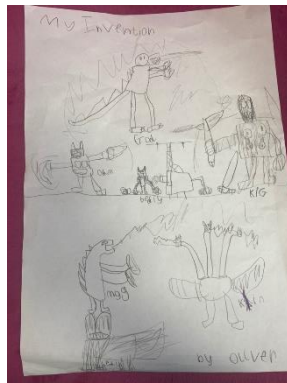
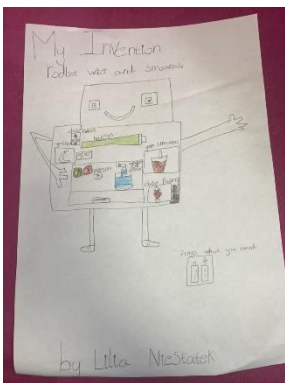

To mark Red Nose Day, the Leopards enjoyed an afternoon of fun, including wearing something red, designing a red nose and going in a red nose hunt!

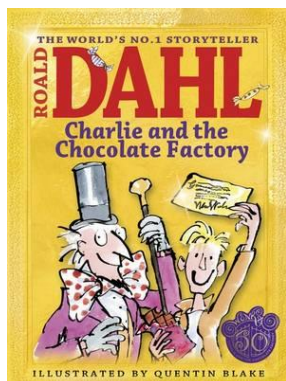
