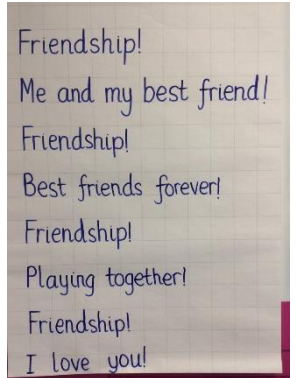


## Spotlight on the Leopards:

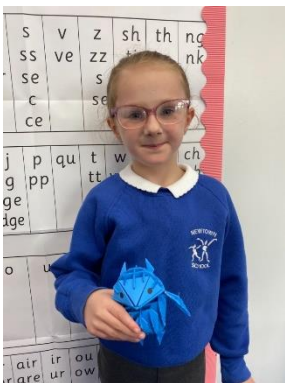
